If it Don't Look Right - Report It!



- Anyone looking in a car or home
- Anyone forcibly entering a car or home
- Someone running from a home or business
- Someone carrying a weapon
- Someone screaming
- Possible gunshots heard
- An unknown adult talking to children, offering them candy or gifts, and/or asking them for help. May use other enticements such as having a puppy or other animal to attract a child's attention.
- Someone who does not appear to belong in the area (DLR)
- A person walking or running in the neighborhood carrying items which could be stolen
- Anyone ringing your doorbell or knocking on your door without a reasonable explanation
- Someone waiting in front of house when no one is home
- Someone going door to door
- Excessive traffic to and from a home
- Someone having a possible mental health issue
- People loitering
- Strange or suspicious vehicles



UNSOLVED CRIME - ARSON



ARSON FIRES AT FWISD SCHOOLS FORT WORTH FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Fort Worth Fire Department's Arson / Bomb Division is asking for the public's help for any information about several fires that occurred on FWISD's property **on Thursday** 9/24/20 and Friday 9/25/20.

On Thursday 9/24, a male suspect set two fires at two different Fort Worth ISD schools. The first fire was set at Versia Williams Elementary at 901 Baurline Street. The suspect then set a fire a short time later inside Maudrie Walton Elementary's library at 5816 Rickenbacker Place.

Then on Friday 9/25/20, the same person then started fires in the FWISD Administration building, maintenance facility, and several other locations in the West 7th area.





The City of Fort Worth developed <u>One Address</u> as a part of our initiative to improve the accessibility, transparency, and accountability of the City of Fort Worth government.

City agencies routinely produce large amounts of data intended to serve the public better, but it is often stored in disparate ways or in separate locations which makes it difficult to use. Centralizing this data gives citizens a more efficient way to find useful information.

This application was built using data from Fort Worth's <u>Open Data Portal</u>. The tool below queries the same database and tailors the information specific to Police and other useful information.

The City of Fort Worth is partnering with Deaf Link to provide the Accessible Hazard Alert Sys-

tem (AHAS) which will send accessible alert messages to registered residents who are Deaf, Blind, Hard of Hearing, or Deaf/Blind before, during, and after an emergency or disaster in the City of Fort Worth.

Fort Worth AHAS subscribers in an area affected by an emergency or disaster will be able to receive an accessible alert message in American Sign Language (ASL) and English voice and text. The alert message could include information about the emergency and what actions to take.

Fort Worth AHAS will send accessible alert messages to internet and video capable devices such as computers, cell phones, smart phones, tablet computers, and wireless Braille readers.
